- ✓ Let your students freely explore the device! You might be surprised by what they already know.
- ✓ With ableEXPERIENCE, you can try multiple apps to discover which apps your students recognize or feel most comfortable using.
- ✓ Exploration helps reveal strengths such as motor planning, categorization, and the ability to imitate models.
- ✓ Open the device to motivating pages, like “toys” or “fun,” and invite your students to browse and make selections.
- ✓ Give them the opportunity to identify their favorite activities and items without needing to guess or present every toy in your therapy space.
- ✓ Let their choices guide your sessions and build rapport.
- ✓ Start your therapy journey with sensory supports already in place.
- ✓ Program phrases like “I need a break” or add icons for headphones and fidgets, giving students immediate access to self-advocacy and regulation tools.
- ✓ Don't wait for frustration or communication breakdowns—model AAC use from the beginning to foster calm, confident communication.
