#### 2 ) Age and Handling:

Younger children may find the Mini QTF easier to handle due to its size and weight. The Standard QTF, while robust, may be less manageable for younger users. Feel confident that you can swap sizes to fit the device user's changing needs throughout their development.

### For Mini QuickTalker Freestyle Users:

If you're currently using the Mini QuickTalker Freestyle (Mini QTF), consider the following factors:

#### 1 ) Grid Size and Visibility:

If the device user is using a larger grid on the Mini QTF, they might struggle to view all icons and text clearly. A transition to the Standard QTF could enhance visual clarity.

#### 2 ) Age and Growth:

The Mini QTF is often ideal for younger users due to its compact size. However, as a child grows, the larger screen and enhanced durability of the Standard QTF might be more suitable.

#### 3 ) Visual Impairments:
