Team Spotlight:

Hello from the North America Business Development Team! The team consists of Director, Charlie Rowell, and Senior Manager, Brendan Murray. Our role is to attract businesses throughout the US and Canada and develop relationships with key multipliers. Despite the continued market uncertainty, our team is positioned to have a record year. After October, we have exceeded our targets while also surpassing our 2020 deal flow from Site Selectors:

- Qualified Leads Generated: 95 (105% to Goal)
- Leads Converted to Projects: 21 (105% to Goal)
- 16 of 95 2021 Qualified Leads Converted to Projects or 16.8%
- 12 Offers & 7 App/Accepts
- 14 Qualified Leads Generated from Site Selectors

BD NA generates leads from client nurturing and outreach, management of two lead generators (NuGrowth and ROI), regular trade show attendance, and strategic interactions with commercial real estate brokers, site selection consultants, etc. One example includes hosting a private event for key executives at the Industrial Asset Management Council (IAMC). This type of event includes real estate decision-makers of Fortune 500 companies, construction firms, railroad partners, and active members of the site selection community. Brendan Murray leads these activities for JobsOhio. The last one was in Kansas City, Missouri, which attracted over 60 attendees and produced several new relationships and opportunities.

Our concerted efforts in Canada and the continual focus on high-cost and highly regulated U.S. locations (California specifically) have generated many new leads. Canada (19) and California (14) are leading the pack in terms of Qualified Leads. From a Sector standpoint, Advanced Manufacturing (34), Food and Agriculture (16), Technology (14), and Logistics and Distribution (11) are generating most of our lead activity. We are continuing to build the pipeline in the other sectors and have seen some promising deals.

The great thing about JobsOhio is that this is a "team effort." The NA BD team has focused the last year or so in terms of building our relationship across the organization and the Network Partners. We are happy to say that this has paid huge dividends in terms of teamwork, strategy, and business development execution. Thank you for your support and partnership!

We look forward to finishing the year on a very high note and continuing to see Ohio grow and prosper from the efforts of all the people working for JobsOhio.
