Potential subcontractors should meet the following requirements to ensure your firm is ready to subcontract with Black & Veatch for U.S. Government contracts.

- Obtain UEI Number
- Obtain a DUNS number
- Active SAM.gov registration
- Online Reps and Certs in SAM.gov
- Certify your SB status, if applicable (i.e. HUBZone/8(a) certifications)
- Financial information in Dun & Bradstreet
- Not be on any restricted party list or debarred to work on U.S Government contracts
- Sufficient insurance coverage: General Liability, Auto Liability, Professional Liability, and Worker's Compensation
