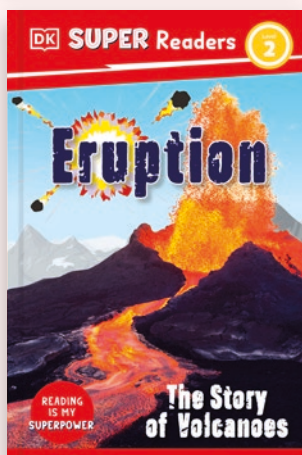
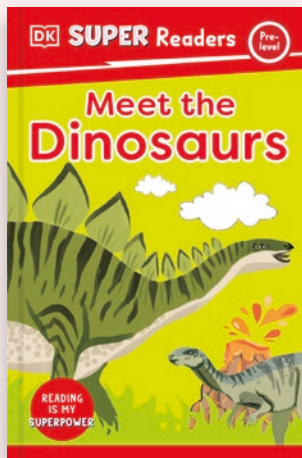



THE TOY HELICOPTER

1878

Wilbur and Orville Wright couldn't wait to see the surprise their father had brought home for them.

"Here it is, boys!"

Their father tossed a small toy into the air. Instead of falling, the toy rose up toward the ceiling. Wilbur and Orville watched in amazement.

"It flies!" exclaimed Orville.

"But how does it fly?" Wilbur wondered.

The two brothers studied the toy helicopter and discovered that it was powered by twisting a rubber band. As they let the helicopter go, the rubber band unwound, causing the propeller to spin quickly and the helicopter to fly in the air. As the propeller slowed down, the helicopter wobbled, then fell to the ground. "Let's make our own helicopters, Orville," Wilbur suggested.

So the boys experimented with their own versions of the toy helicopter. They found that the bigger the helicopter was, the quicker it fell to the ground.

Later, while inventing the first airplane, the Wright brothers would remember the toy helicopters that were their first flying machines.

Rubber band When you stretch or twist a rubber band, it uses force in order to spring back to its usual size. The "brothers" helicopter used a twisted rubber band at its center. The boys called their toy helicopters "toys."

Wilbur Wright was born on August 16, 1867. He was hard-working and enjoyed sports.

Orville Wright was born on August 19, 1871. As a child, he was often very mischievous. These photos were taken in 1878.

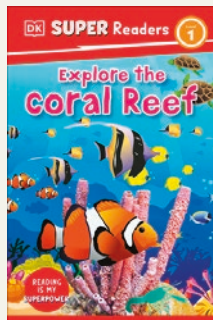
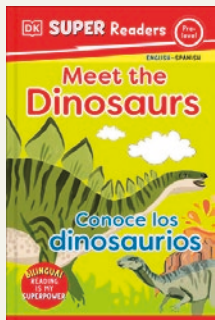

MetaMetrics®: The Lexile® Framework for Reading



The Lexile Framework for Reading is a scientific approach to measuring both reading ability and the difficulty of materials on the same developmental scale.

Reading materials get a measure based on factors such as their vocabulary and complexity. Children receive a Lexile reader measure from an assessment at school. Over 35 million students in all 50 states have been given Lexile measures.

A Lexile measure is an important tool to help find reading materials to match and challenge a child's ability. It also helps teachers personalize learning by providing the best books to boost academic progress and success.

All **DK Super Readers** tiles have a Lexile reader measure. The table below shows the **Lexile range** for each of our levels.
