

Blue: A History of the Color as Deep as the Sea and as Wide as the Sky

Theme: Art History





For centuries, blue powders and dyes were some of the most sought-after materials in the world. Ancient Afghan painters ground mass quantities of lapis lazuli to use for their paints, while snails were harvested in Eurasia for the tiny amounts of blue their bodies would release. And then there was indigo, which was so valuable that American plantations grew it as a cash crop on the backs of enslaved Africans. It wasn't until 1905, when Adolf von Baeyer created a chemical blue dye, that blue could be used for anything and everything—most notably that uniform of workers everywhere, blue jeans.

With stunning illustrations by Caldecott Honor artist Daniel Minter, this vibrant and fascinating picture book follows one color's journey through time and across the world as it becomes the blue we know today.



Painting with Blueberries

What you'll need: A handful of blueberries (add more as needed), water, a blender or fork, paper, a paintbrush

- Blend the blueberries and water in a blender (or mash and stir with a fork if no blender is available).
- 2 Have your child use the juice and paintbrush to paint on the paper.

Like what to eat (important papers, the fancy bird the humans cooked for the fancy dinner, Grandpa's teeth), and what not to eat (bees). He won't get those mixed up, will he?

Pet lovers will see their own goofy fur-friends in Chip's earnest yet ridiculous antics, and readers who love funny animal stories will find their next favorite book buddy in Chip the dog, who's patiently waiting to eat your homework and slobber on your clothes.



Pet Prints

What you'll need: White cardstock, an ink pad or paint, googly eyes, a glue pen, permanent markers, crayons

- 1 Press your child's bare foot into the ink pad or paint, then press the foot to the cardstock. The toes will be the dog's paws, and the heel of the foot will be the dog's face.
- Use the markers or crayons to draw ears, a tail, a nose, a mouth, and a collar.
- 3 Glue the googly eyes on above the mouth and nose.









When Donut, a fluffy, scruffy unicorn with a colorful horn, spots a bird in the air, she thinks, why can't I be up there, too? And so, she jumps! Off a log and even a trampoline. But thump! She falls to the ground. After many attempts at flight (including using wings fashioned out of sticks), Donut schemes with the other animals


in the field and comes up with an ingenious and imaginative solution. Finally, her perseverance pays off—and Donut flies!

With a simple text and expressive art, this is a characterdriven story from a popular author-illustrator duo that's laugh-out-loud funny, ingenious, and sure to appeal to all the unicorn fans out there—especially those who like their unicorns a little on the imperfect side.

Wings for a Unicorn

What you'll need: Rod/dowel, brown craft paper, pencil, colorful craft paper, scissors, glue, ½ inch elastic, duct tape, hot glue


- 1 Fold a 20" x 20" sheet of brown craft paper in half and draw a wing shape using a pencil.
- 2 Open the paper and place the rod/dowel along the fold.
- 3 Brush glue gum over the paper, fold it, and smooth it shut.
- Cut along the pencil lines and glue again, as needed.
- 5 Cut colorful paper in the shape of scales or feathers in a range of sizes.
- Start gluing the larger scales or feathers to the bottom and work toward the top.
- 2 Lay down a T-shape of duct tape along the top middle part of the wings.
- 8 Measure a length of elastic against your child to form two loose arm loops.
- Attach the length of elastic exactly in the middle of your T shape with hot glue. Then fold in the ends and secure with more hot glue.
- Tape some duct tape (8 inches) directly over the middle of the elastic loops to secure and press down.

Back-to-School Time Capsule

What you'll need: Mason jar, paper, pencil, construction paper, scissors, string, ribbon, confetti, glue

- ① Decorate a mason jar with construction paper and label it "Back-to-School Time Capsule."
- Have your child write information about themselves on a piece of paper, such as what they want to learn that year and their favorite things. You can find printable sheets with prewritten questions online. Fold the paper, roll it up, and put it in the mason jar.
- 3 Trace your child's hand on a piece of construction paper.


 Cut it out and add it to the jar.
- 4 Have your child stand against a wall and use string to measure their height. Cut it the same length as your child and add it to the jar.
- Add confetti and any other items such as favorite toys or photos to the jar.
- **6** Seal it and tie a bow around the top lip of the jar with ribbon.
- Open the jar at the end of the year!
