Broadcast: The Perilous Fight - Part 2

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Dr. James Dobson: Welcome everyone to Family Talk. It's a ministry of the James Dobson Family

Institute, supported by listeners just like you. I'm Dr. James Dobson and I'm

thrilled that you've joined us.

Roger Marsh: Well, welcome back to Family Talk, the broadcast division of the Dr. James

Dobson Family Institute. I'm Roger Marsh. You know, the family is at the heart of our communities and our nation. When the family is strong, so is our nation. But when a family is weak, our country seems to start imploding from within. This is a precarious battle that we all face. And as believers, we know that by building God-led families, we will realize more peace and more stability, not only in our lives, but in the culture on the whole. Today's guest here on Family Talk is Dr. Ben Carson and he'll be discussing his brand new book, *The Perilous*

Fight with our own Dr. James Dobson.

Dr. Carson is a retired neurosurgeon who spent over two decades in various positions at Johns Hopkins Hospital. He was the youngest major division director in the hospital's history when, at the age of 33. And then in 2016, Dr. Carson was a candidate for President of the United States. And from 2017 to 2021, he served as the United States Secretary of Housing and Urban Development under the 45th President of the United States, Donald Trump. Now let's join Dr. James Dobson and his guest, Dr. Ben Carson for more of their conversation right now

on Family Talk.

Dr. James Dobson: Well, let's talk about your book. I'm excited about this because it deals with an

issue that I'm so deeply concerned about. I really believe that America is not going to survive, or at least not the way it was designed, if we go down the path

that we're presently treading.

Dr. Ben Carson: That's exactly right. And the reason I wrote the book is I noticed that we were

going down a very dangerous path, a path that many other countries have gone down and they have not survived intact as a result of it. And there are those who want to fundamentally change this country and move us to a more Marxist type of ideology. But they know they cannot overcome us militarily, so they have to overcome us from within. Jesus said it best, "The house divided against

itself cannot stand." Abraham Lincoln repeated it.

Dr. James Dobson: Yeah, he did.

Dr. Ben Carson: How did you divide that house? How do you divide that very strong nation like

ours? You go to its very foundation. And what is its foundation? The family. That's where the strength comes from. That's where the values are passed on. That's where children learn to respect others and other people's ideals. That's where they get their morality from. And if you can erode that, it doesn't take

long for it to have a dramatic impact on the society.

And witness what's happening in our colleges today. And how young people who've grown up at a time when they spent much more time with social media and staring at a screen on their iPhone than they did with their parents and with their families. And also you look at the dissolution of the family. It really started to become very easy in the '60s, with no-fault divorce. And that doesn't take into account the fact that if you make divorce real easy, a lot of people are going to take that avenue. But you take two people and you put them together after they've grown up in different environments, there's going to be friction. It's like rubbing two pieces of sandpaper together. But if you keep rubbing them, they become smooth. You've got to stay in there long enough for them to be smooth.

And we're not preaching that anymore. And we're teaching people, it's about me and it's about how I feel and what's good for me. That is not conducive to strong family life. And the interesting thing is you look at the findings of the liberal think tanks and the conservative think tanks, they all show the same thing that children raised in the traditional nuclear family do better. They do better financially, they do better in terms of staying out of trouble with the law and in terms of their contributions to society. Everything is better and there's really no controversy about that.

Dr. James Dobson: Has it broken your heart as it has mine in recent days where all of this violence has occurred on the campuses, a hatred of each other and every evil?

Yes. Interestingly enough, when you look at the congressional record, January the 10th 1963, Congressman Herlong of Florida read into the record the 45 goals of Communists in America. One of them, number 19, was to foment violent riots by the young people in favor of the radical left's agenda. So these things have been going on for a long time. It is not of recent origin. It's been manifested recently because the opportunity has presented itself. It's a real issue. Our young people can be saved and they may well be the solution to our problem. I've been going to a lot of universities lately with Turning Point USA, Charlie Kirk's organization, and the student response has been just amazing. We've had to turn hundreds of students away that can't get them into the auditoriums. They understand that the pathway that we're on does not bode

Dr. Ben Carson: On Poverty.

Dr. James Dobson: Yes.

Dr. Ben Carson: And they said that there were a few things that you could do that would reduce

the rate of poverty to 2% or less. And that was finish high school. So important to get that basic education. Wait until you're married to have children and get a

job.

Dr. James Dobson: If you do those three things, you almost never face poverty.

Dr. Ben Carson: That's exactly right. And there was a time in our country where that wasn't

news. Now it is. People say, "Oh, really?" It seems like we've lost our common sense. And that is very disturbing. But the Brookings Institution, also working with Princeton University, did a study, I think it's on page 47 of the book, in which they looked at states that were doing the best in terms of wealth, in terms of upward mobility, in terms of childhood poverty, in terms of crime. And they found that the states that had the highest ratio of traditional nuclear families were the ones with the greatest wealth, the least amount of poverty,

the greatest amount of opportunities and the least amount of crime.

Dr. James Dobson: And yet that's not the direction we're going.

Dr. Ben Carson: And what we need to do if we really cared about our country and our nation is we need to be looking at these studies and saying, "Are our policies helping or

hurting in relationship to the things that we desire to happen for the population?" And we unfortunately aren't doing that today. We have people saying, "What's good for my party? And what gives me more power?" Rather than, "What's good for the people?" And the people are really the source of correction because our founders knew that we would reach this point. Because they studied every government system in the world and they discovered that they all move in the same direction, grow, infiltrate, and dominate. No matter how they start, no matter what their lofty ideals are, that's what governments

do. And it's not because they're bad, it's because that's what they do. Just like lions kill lambs, why did they do that? Not because they're bad animals, but they

do it because they're lions.

So they had to give us a system that would prevent the government from doing that to our people. And that's how we got our Constitution. But you have to pay attention to it because even with the Constitution in place, you can see the forces that are trying to grow and infiltrate and dominate the people and trying to give us mandates and telling us, "You must drive this kind of car. And you must do this. And you must do that." That was never the intention. And the power to change it lies in the hands of the people. They have to learn how to use that power appropriately. And that's another purpose of the book. We talk about that. But using the vote appropriately instead of just looking for the name that looks familiar, why not do a little bit of homework and figure out who these

people are and whether they in fact are the people who represent you and your ideals. That would make a huge difference.

Dr. James Dobson: Do you have hope for America?

Dr. Ben Carson: I have a lot of hope for America. And if God was willing to save Sodom and

Gomorrah for 10 people, we should be okay.

Dr. James Dobson: What is the source of that hope then?

Dr. Ben Carson: Well, that hope is our faith. Think about it. Our founding document, the

Declaration of Independence, talks about certain inalienable rights given to us by our Creator aka God. Only God gives us the rights, only He has the right to take away, not some government or government official. We need to recognize that and act accordingly. And I think we're getting there. I think it's always darkest before the dawn. And sometimes it has to be pretty dark before people can see the light. But I think the light is there. I think people are seeing it and they're realizing that the pathway that we're on is a destructive pathway. A lot of the recent polling has shown that 70% of the people think we're moving in the wrong direction. That's a huge number. And all we have to do, I think, is

provide the right kind of leadership now.

Dr. James Dobson: Doc, you're younger than I am and I was in graduate school working on a

doctorate in the late '60s when everything came apart like we're seeing to some degree today. And it broke my heart because I was witnessing a change in culture that I knew was going to have radical consequences for us. In fact, I wrote my first book, *Dare to Discipline*, in response to what was going on there

at that time.

Dr. Ben Carson: Yeah, my wife read that book to our kids as they were growing up.

Dr. James Dobson: Read Dare to Discipline?

Dr. Ben Carson: Yes.

Dr. James Dobson: No kidding.

Dr. Ben Carson: Absolutely. And it was a wise move because when they felt like doing

something, they would harken back to what you said in the book.

Dr. James Dobson: My goodness.

Dr. Ben Carson: It was very good. My wife was a voracious reader, a Yale graduate, a graduate of

Johns Hopkins, master's degree. But she felt that her greatest challenge and

reward was raising our children. And she did a splendid job.

Dr. James Dobson: How many children do you have?

Dr. Ben Carson: Three sons. My three sons. And they all got married in 2011. And between them

we have eight grandchildren.

Dr. James Dobson: That must be a great thrill to you.

Dr. Ben Carson: It's wonderful. But it's also the reason that I stay involved because what kind of

life are they going to have if our country continues down this road?

Dr. James Dobson: What is your greatest concern for America today?

Dr. Ben Carson: Making enemies of each other. Allowing ourselves to be divided on the basis of

race, age, income, gender, political affiliation, religion, dividing everybody up to

the point where we hate each other. And I have an acrostic that I use

frequently. It's called WANE, W-A-N-E. We've allowed hatred and division to wax for a long time, now it's time for it to wane. And that stands for We Are Not Enemies. WANE. That's what we need to be doing. And if we don't do that, we

will certainly be destroyed.

Dr. James Dobson: I'm interested in the title of your book, *The Perilous Fight: Overcoming Our*

Culture's War on the American Family.

Dr. Ben Carson: Well, the reason I call it *The Perilous Fight* is because this country was born in

the crucible of conflict. We weren't given our freedom. We had to fight for it. Not only during the Revolutionary War, but during the war of 1812 when we almost got recaptured by Great Britain. And we're at a precipice like that currently also. Which way are we going to go as a country? Are we going to be a country that's about the people and that's about our faith and about our sense

of community and togetherness? Or are we going to allow ourselves to be manipulated into thinking that we're enemies and rip ourselves apart?

Dr. James Dobson: That's why you call it a culture war.

Dr. Ben Carson: Definitely a culture war. Our faith and our families are the basis of our identity.

And when ISIS comes in and they conquer a place, what do they do? They get rid of your identity. They get rid of your history. So that they can replace it with what they want you to believe. And what do Marxists always do? They dumb down the population because people who are dumbed down are much easier to manipulate. And you've probably noticed on the television when they have those men on the street interviews and they ask people the simplest questions, who was the first president? What countries border America? How many branches of government are they? How many Supreme Court? They have no

idea. They have no clue.

Dr. James Dobson: I've watched those programs and I've seen other people laugh. It's not a

laughing matter to me.

Dr. Ben Carson: No.

Dr. James Dobson: It's serious and it's disaster.

Dr. Ben Carson: It's very serious. And it's the precursor to manipulation and domination. And it

always occurs before countries become socialist and communist. And that's why I put so much emphasis on education, upon true education, not upon learning about critical race theory and what pronouns you should use. I'm talking about American history, world history, mathematics, science, being able to express yourself appropriately, having perspective on what's going on in the world, true education. And if you really want to be impressed, there was a time when we really, in this country, emphasized education. I think it had a lot to do with our success. Go back and look at a sixth grade exit exam from 150 to 200 years ago. It will blow your mind. And people today just don't know that stuff anymore.

Dr. James Dobson: How did your mother keep you from being wounded and destroyed by racism?

Dr. Ben Carson: Well, she always emphasized that people are people and she never bought into

the concept that this group of people is bad and this group of people is good. Individuals in different groups are good and bad, but not the whole groups.

Dr. James Dobson: Was she angry about what the culture tried to do to her and her children?

Dr. Ben Carson: Not really. I mean, she was not naive, she understood what was going on. I

remember when we went to Tennessee when I was six years old and there were whites only and color only signs up. She made sure that we understood what that meant and said, "It won't be like that when you go back to Detroit." And we always talked about them, made sure that we understood them. And that way you stay out of trouble, navigate your way, and you can be a light fixture wherever you go. Did we run into people who were racist? Absolutely, we did.

But how do you treat those people?

And we found that when you treat those people with respect and kindness, it has a profound ameliorating effect on them. I remember at one point, this is after I was an adult and grew up and had a family, we bought a farm in a rural area of Maryland that was known for Ku Klux Klan rallies and things like that. And in fact, one of the neighbors immediately put up a Confederate flag when we moved in. And all the other neighbors put up American flags and he took it down. And we were very gracious and kind to them. They subsequently became

friends of ours.

Dr. James Dobson: That's the bottom line of your book, isn't it?

Dr. Ben Carson: That's what it's all about. Know what's going on. Don't go into this with your

eyes closed and then wake up surprised and say, "Oh, how did this happen?" It's happening right before our eyes and we all can play a part in reversing the

downfall.

Dr. James Dobson: Dr. Carson, thank you for being our guest today. I appreciate so much what you

are doing in the cause of Christ.

Dr. Ben Carson: Well, thank you for having me. And as I said during the program, your writings

were a big part of my kids growing up. They've all turned out to be very

successful, and I want to thank you for that. Always inspired after talking to you.

Roger Marsh: And that concludes part two of Dr. James Dobson's conversation with Dr. Ben

Now, this week is a monumental week here on Family Talk because of what we've seen in the Biden Administration aiming at Christians and Americans in general, but Christians in particular. And Dr. Dobson has joined forces with Gary Bauer and our own president, Joe Waresak, to draft

a letter that addresses some of these issues. Gary Bauer, the senior vice

president of public policy at the Dr. James Dobson Family Institute joins me right now. And Gary, let's talk about the importance for this letter. Why was it so important for you and Dr. and Joe to put this letter together right now as we're

warming up in the campaign election season?

Gary Bauer: First of all, it's good to be with you, Roger. It hit Dr. Dobson and I and others

that if we look at the big picture here, it's horrible. I mean, yes, there are these individual battles, but there is an agenda being promoted in Washington, D.C. that is anti-family, anti-religious liberty, anti-life at its core. And it's coming out of literally every one of the federal government agencies. And sadly, it's all being directed and promoted out of the White House by the president. Now, we just thought that at this critical time in our country, a lot of divisions, it was absolutely essential as Americans to let the president know why we are so upset about the direction of the country. So we've looked at a whole panorama of issues including foreign policy, the economy, and so forth, but we really zeroed in on these Constitutional rights that are so precious to us, and we hope to everybody. And we're hoping to get a whole lot of people to sign this letter with

us and to respectfully send it to the president for his consideration.

Roger Marsh: Well, it's easy to find this letter. We've posted it at

drjamesdobson.org/bidenopenletter. And this is a letter you could read that Gary was talking about that talks about these policy issues. We're not attacking the president personally, but rather attacking all of these policy issues, nearly 30 of them. And each of them, Gary, I was impressed with the fact that you and Dr. put together this list with citations, with actual examples of each and every one of these violations here, to bring them to the attention of the White House and say, "Look, we're asking you to reverse course, what you're doing here. You openly campaigned in 2020 as the guy who was going to bring America together

and everything you're doing now is driving us further apart."

Gary Bauer: Well, that's a great summary. The citations, Roger, are absolutely necessary

because as we've seen in recent years, if you speak truth to power, it's

immediately labeled misinformation.

Roger Marsh: Right.

Gary Bauer: When in fact, it is the exact opposite. So we wanted to do our homework and

we've done that. But quite frankly, it wasn't that hard because every day there's articles, there's commentary, there's announcements coming from various government agencies, and they almost always have the same themes, which I alluded to earlier. They go to religious liberty, for example, let me just mention one thing. People have probably heard of conscience rights. That is, if you are a

Christian in this country, you can't be forced to do something in your employment or in your personal life or in your home or whatever, that is contrary to the teachings of your faith. And we're finding that this

administration across the board is violating that. And one example is they're trying to force Christian doctors who are morally opposed to abortion to be involved in the act of performing an abortion or providing as a nurse, the backup to that abortion. That should never happen in the United States. Wherever you are on the issue, nobody, I would hope, is forcing somebody to

take an innocent human life.

Roger Marsh: This is a powerful instrument and it's a great tool that you can use not only for

your own edification, but also to make Washington, D.C. aware of the fact that we are paying attention and they are on notice right now when it comes to this election, 2024.
