Dr. James Dobson: Well, hello everyone. I'm James Dobson and you're listening to Family Talk, a

listener-supported ministry. In fact, thank you so much for being part of that

support for James Dobson Family Institute.

Roger Marsh: Well, welcome again friends, to Family Talk. I'm Roger Marsh. And if you've ever

been blessed by something in your life and you had no doubt that God had answered your prayer, well, you know how important that blessing was in your life no matter how big or small the answer to your prayer actually was. God loves to bless others through His people. So it's incredibly important that we

learn to hear God's voice and to be obedient when we are called upon.

Today's guest here on Family Talk will share some touching stories with our own

Dr. James Dobson about this very important topic. His name is Dr. Bruce

Wilkinson.

Did you know that Jesus spoke about money more than He did about Heaven and Hell combined? In fact, 11 of the 39 parables in the New Testament deal with money. Dr. Bruce Wilkinson will share more about this and his book called *The God Pocket* and how we as believers can ask God to help others here on

Earth. Dr. Bruce Wilkinson has a doctorate of divinity from Western

Conservative Baptist Seminary. He's best known for his extremely successful book, *The Prayer of Jabez*. Bruce and his wife Darlene have three grown children

and many grandchildren. Now let's join Dr. James Dobson and Dr. Bruce

Wilkinson on today's classic edition of Family Talk.

Dr. James Dobson: Bruce, thanks so much for being with us again. And we talked last time about

money, about what the Bible says about money, and even more specifically what Jesus said about money when He was on this earth. Now, let's go from the theological understanding, and I hope people got what you were saying because there's just an awful lot there to think about, and we will make a CD available to anybody who wants to ask for it. But to get practical with that, we come to your

book, The God Pocket. But I want you to explain what the God pocket is.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: All right, let me start with a question, Jim. Let's say that I lost my job, and I've

maxed out all my credit cards, and I have four kids home and my wife and I don't have enough money for food, really. And I'm begging God, "God, if you're

up there, you got to give me money." And God sits on His throne and He listens to all of our millions of requests, and He hears this young man praying for this. And God says the answer is, "Yes. Give him the money." All right, now, peel away the veil between heaven and Earth. How is God going to get the money to the young man? God could speak money into existence in heaven and let dollar bills float down from heaven, but He doesn't. He could send an angel down with the money, but not one time in the Bible does He. But He could. If you study this biblically, how does God get money to a person who needs it? Answer.

Dr. James Dobson:

It comes from other godly people.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: That's right. Which means God must have a human partner for Him to answer the person's prayer. That's a staggering thought. So the verse we talked about in the last program is mind-boggling. It's Proverbs 19:17. It says exactly what I'm saying, "He that has compassion on the poor," meaning you give to the poor,

"lends to the Lord." Let me explain that.

I was in Africa with my son Dave, and I'd spoken all week to 20,000 leaders at the Dome in Johannesburg, 10,000 business professionals and 10,000 religious leaders. At the end of the week, Dave and I hurried back to the hotel to have a bowl of ice cream. It was 10:00 o'clock at night and the place closed at 10:00. And we got there right before 10:00, sat down in the little table and I said to the waitress, I said, "Ma'am, my son and I ran over here from the Dome. Can we get two bowls of ice cream?"

She says, "Oh, I'm so sorry the kitchen's closed, but we have some old gray decaf coffee." I said, "Oh man, we really did hurry over here. Could you possibly reconsider?" And she saw it being my son and she says, "Well, okay." So she turns, Jim, to go back to the kitchen and God, I don't know how God does this, Jim, but God said to me very clearly, "Give her a big tip." Now, I already do give people a big tip. And I'm sitting there thinking, "How much." And I had been at the bank at the beginning of the week to get South African money and my son's opposite me and he leans over, he said, "Dad, we're supposed to give that lady a really big tip." I almost fell off the chair. I said, "Dave, what are you talking about?" He said, "No. And dad, you're supposed to give her the tip." He's like our son, right?

Dr. James Dobson: Yeah. Had you shared that with him?

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: No. No. I was just kind of sitting there thinking. So I said to Dave, "Do you know

> how much?" He said, "No." So I'm exhausted from the week and I'm befuddled and I have my cash in my front left pocket. I take out the South African rand and I'm just wondering, "Do I give her 20 rand or I give her 10? Or it's only two bowls of ice cream." And I give up and I took this wad, it was a big wad of South African rand, it was a lot of money. I folded it in half and she came over to me and I said to her, "Ma'am, you are so kind to get Dave and me some ice cream. We want to give you an extra tip." And I quickly stuck it in her apron pocket. I

didn't want my son to see how much I was giving her, and I didn't want her to see how much I was giving, and I felt very uncomfortable.

Well, David and I are eating our ice cream. Now, Jim, this really explains what I mean with this. She comes back a few minutes later crying and she stands right next to the table and she says, "you know Jesus." And I looked at her and there was no Bible on the table, I didn't wear a collar or anything. And I said, "Why would you say that?" "Because He's the only one who knows." "He's the only one who knows what? "I'm by myself. I have a little baby. And the tips have been terrible and I haven't paid my rent. And my landlord told me this morning that if I don't have the entire amount for my rent for the two months I'm behind, he's taking everything I own out of the one room I rent, throwing on the dirt and throwing me and my baby out." And she said, "On the way, I took three buses to get here. And I said to God, 'If You love me and if You love my baby, then give me the money for the rent tonight." And she takes out this wad and she's crying. She said, "Only Jesus knew that's exactly how much I owed him."

Now, see, she didn't thank me for the money. Why not? It wasn't my money.

Dr. James Dobson: She thanked Jesus for it.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: Because she knew who gave it.

Dr. James Dobson: Now, that's a very important point in your book, that when you give what you

don't owe, because it wouldn't be a gift if you owed it, and you recognize a need in someone or the Lord gives you that little nudge, you're opening their heart,

not to you.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: No.

Dr. James Dobson: But to the Lord.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: That's right. And Jim, so few people today understand what you and I have just

said, that God is actively hunting for people that he can partner with to deliver a financial, and to her, if I said to you, "What was this tonight?" You know what she'd say. "That was a miracle for me." Well, how come it was a miracle? Because she knew the chances of a white guy giving her 500 plus dollars for a bowl of ice cream. And she knew that it was her last moment because the whole restaurant was closing, and she was going to have to get on and go those three buses to go back and get there probably at home 11:30 to midnight and be kicked out. Now Jim, when you begin to understand how Heaven and earth cooperate, do you realize how many amazing experiences you can have? Because there's So few people who will partner with God. That's what *The God*

Pocket book is all about. It teaches you how does it actually work.

Dr. James Dobson: Bruce, I believe everything you just said, because I grew up with it. And my

father was such a godly man and I watched him follow that principle. And my

dad was an evangelist and in those days he drove an old car maybe 1000 miles to hold a revival meeting someplace and there wasn't a lot of money given and it was all free will. And on the last night, my dad would come down to the end of that ten-day service, a lot of people had found the Lord, he had a wonderful gift of leading people to the Lord. And he would notice that the pastor's kids didn't have coats for winter and he would take what they gave him and he would give it to the pastor and also raise a little love offering for him.

Then he would drive home. And my mother would meet him in the living room. And I can see it, I've got it videotaped in my mind, and she would come and greet him and she would throw her arms around him and welcome him home, and so would I, I was an only child and I was watching all this, and eventually the subject would come up. "How much did they pay you?" And my dad would grin. And she would say, "I know. You gave it all away, didn't you?" And he would say, "This pastor was in such need and their kids didn't have good shoes and I couldn't take the money. And I gave it, but the Lord will take care of us." I watched that. I saw it.

And inevitably we ran out of money too. And I remember one time in particular where this very thing had happened and the next morning my folks were talking about our financial needs and we went into my little bedroom and closed the door and I don't know why. And my dad would pray and he would say, "Lord, You told us that if we would be generous with Your people in our good times, that You would help us when we had a need and we have a need now and that we look to You to help us meet it." And money came.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: Yes.

Dr. James Dobson: And on one occasion, about two days later, \$1,200 came in an envelope.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: Wow.

Dr. James Dobson: And that was a lot. That was a half a year's salary and it would come. And so my

dad followed that principle, the principle you're talking about, all the way through. And then he had a heart attack and as it turned out, he wasn't going to live very long. And he and my mother were in the bedroom. She was getting dressed, they were going someplace, and he was already dressed and he was lying on the bed. And I wasn't there. My mother told me about this. And she looked over at him and he was crying. And she said, "Why are you crying?" And he said, "Well, it's the strangest thing. I was lying here on the bed. I wasn't praying or anything. The Lord spoke to me." And she said, "Well, what did He

say?" And he said, "He told me something about you."

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: Oh my gosh.

Dr. James Dobson: And she said, "Then you are going to tell me." And he said, "Well, it was the

strangest thing. I was just lying here. And the Lord said He was going to take

care of you."

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: See.

Dr. James Dobson: And I worried about my parents when one of them died or when my dad

couldn't work because they didn't accumulate anything. My dad gave most of it away. And he said, "The Lord's going to take care of you." He died three days later. And I was, being the only child and only son, I had the responsibility for the finances and I got into their records and didn't have anything. And they owned a house that wasn't paid for, but it was worth \$45,000 and that's all the money that my mother had. And in a few years, she had Parkinson's and she required \$50,000 a year in 24 hour day care. This was a long time ago. And where was that going to come from? And my grandfather had given some stock

in Coca-Cola to my dad.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: Oh, mercy.

Dr. James Dobson: And it had just burgeoned it. It really grown enormously. And I never had to give

\$1 to my mother. Every bill.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: Isn't that just like God, Jim?

Dr. James Dobson: Every bill was paid and I inherited money from them. It is amazing how God

answered that prayer.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: Yes.

Dr. James Dobson: Because He's faithful.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: He is so faithful. And that's the part that you saw lived out in front of you.

Dr. James Dobson: I did. And when you give to others, your kids see it.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: Yes, they do.

Dr. James Dobson: And your brothers and sisters and your neighbors and your church friends see it.

And it doesn't go to waste. It not only helps the person you give it to, but it also

blesses them and says, "Go thou and do likewise."

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: It does.

Dr. James Dobson: Now, Bruce, something happened last night that is relevant to what we're

talking about today. And I wasn't sure what direction we were going, but you came in to my office today in preparation for this broadcast and you told me a

story of something that just happened. Share it with our listeners.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: Oh my. Well, last night I was out.

Dr. James Dobson: This is the truth now, I promise.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: Last night I was at a banquet just outside of San Jose in California in a town

called Dublin. And they had 500 people come, of all different denominations, all to celebrate a pro-life center. And this pro-life center had a sonogram machines, ultrasound machines, and they were desperate for some funds and God dramatically moved. There were 500 people in that last night. They gave

\$445,000.

Dr. James Dobson: Unbelievable.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: And when people were leaving and I was signing books for them, a lady comes

up out of the blue and I had told the people, because I knew of their love and respect for you, I said, because of the banquet topic, I said, "I'm going to enjoy seeing Dr. Dobson tomorrow for lunch." And I said, "We've been friends a long time." And people applauded because they love what you've done. And this lady comes up and says, she slides this piece of paper across the table, Jim, this

never happened to me.

She says, "Would you give this to Dr. Dobson tomorrow?" Well, I thought it was going to be a note. And I looked at it and it wasn't a note, it was a check. And I said, "This is a check." "Yes." "Is this for Dr. Dobson?" "Yes, it's for the ministry because I really believe in what he's doing." "You would. Well, do you want to write a note for this?" "No, I think he knows who I am and I just want to bless what he does." And she smiled and she left. And so here I am, I come down for lunch for you, and I've never ever delivered a big check like that to somebody.

And I said, "Jim, do you think this will cover lunch today?"

Dr. James Dobson: And it was \$1000.00.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: Yes, it was.

Dr. James Dobson: Unbelievable.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: As you're listening, Jim and I just cut a number of programs together and we

could talk for hours yet because that's our friendship, but as you're listening and being ministered to, I mean who couldn't have been ministered to by his story he just shared about his dad and his mom and the giving. And now he stands on his parents' shoulders and his two children are on their him and Shirley's shoulders. And whether you've ever thought about this, you got one of your feet on his shoulders, don't you? Because he's been building and Shirley's been building into your life and ministering to you and his heart is to reach so many

more people.

So what don't you do what the woman did? Why don't you spontaneously today, just take one of those checks out or call up or something and send a note in. The lady should have sent a note and said, "Jim, thanks so much." Just that little note means so much to people like Jim and I, who are in ministry and the front lines all the time. But wouldn't it be great if there was, I don't know, 1000 ladies like that who just today sent in, whoa, why not, \$1000.00? Write a note, "Jim, I can't thank you enough, but I want more people to know. Here's a gift."

Dr. James Dobson:

Bruce, do you realize that the majority of the people listening to us will think that is a setup that all of this entire conversation has been driving in that direction? Tell them that's not true.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson:

That's not true. And I didn't even give you eye contact, did you? I looked away because I didn't want you waving at me. Friends, this is my idea. Why do I feel this way? Because these ministries that you are listening to, it's just like the banquet last night, that one of us gets up and speaks and ministers. You've been getting up and speaking and ministering on the radio for years and years and years and years and years. And, people, if they only knew how much it costs just to buy a half an hour on a radio station, they would say, "Oh my goodness." So my encouragement to you is from another leader. I didn't ask Jim because I didn't want him to have the possibility of saying, "Don't do that." I just went ahead and did it and hope they don't edit it out.

Dr. James Dobson:

Bruce, you have changed your specific daily responsibility. You built, walked through the Bible to be the largest seminar teaching ministry in the world. And now you're doing something else that I find really interesting and it's not unrelated to what you're talking about right here. What sis that passion?

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson:

Jim, this is something that's been your passion and it's surprising to Darlene and me a lot that God redirected our whole life. I mean, we had a full life like you do and then God directed us to the original God Pocket, which is the womb of a woman that God gives birth to a miracle in. And as you've been fighting this battle for all these years, trying to love on the women who are unexpectedly pregnant? You know Planned Parenthood budget's over a billion dollars? And you know what? Believe it or not, that individuals and foundations give as much to Planned Parenthood as the government does.

Dr. James Dobson:

That's hard to believe.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson:

It is hard to believe. And so we're out there helping these crisis pregnancy centers. I will have spoken at 87 different crisis pregnancy center banquets. And God's just blessing. I think honestly, Jim, it's like the bowl in heaven when the prayers of the saints get so it overflows and God acts. I think something happened in heaven because people are rising up in ways I've never seen. They're giving huge amounts of money for publicity and advertising and being open on the weekend and buy another sonogram machine.

Dr. James Dobson: And you've got a little booklet that you carry in your pocket, you got it open

now, that lists what has happened in recent days.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: We were in Bowie, Maryland. The Lord moved the people, and they gave

\$622,000 at the banquet. Then to Dallas, Texas, 500-

Dr. James Dobson: That's unheard of.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: It is unheard of. It is a movement of God, Jim. You were talking earlier when we

at lunch about the days when God's spirit just opened doors.

Dr. James Dobson: Yeah.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: And you can't explain. You stand there with your mouth open.

Dr. James Dobson: Yeah.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: That's what's happening here. God, I think said in Heaven, "It's enough of my

babies. It's enough. No more." And next year, I honestly believe that all of the work that you and all of these centers have been doing, I think it's going to split open. Honestly, I do. Next year. This is an era that calls for greatness from each of us to rise up and do things that we would've never imagined ourselves doing

because this era, this time we're living, demands it from us.

Dr. James Dobson: Bruce, I have loved this time talking to you. It's been so inspirational and so

enlightening. And it always is when you come. Thank you for being with us. Thank you for *The God Pocket* and the concept of giving. And I believe a lot of

people are going to be touched by it.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: Thank you, Jim, and bless you.

Dr. James Dobson: Would you come back?

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: I will come back.

Dr. James Dobson: Again and again and again.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: Keep standing for the truth, my friend.

Dr. James Dobson: Oh, we love you.

Dr. Bruce Wilkinson: You too.
