First Priority

Definition

Portfolio Prioritization

Port-fo-li-o Pri-or-i-ti-za-tion

Definition: The process of ranking and selecting projects or initiatives within a portfolio of work based on their alignment with strategic objectives, resource availability, and potential benefits.

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When 'Prioritization' Isn't Prioritization

What to look for when starting from scratch...

What to look for

- Informal, ad-hoc decision-making
- o Intuitive judgments, minimal data
- Reactive, vocal stakeholder influence
- Resource and documentation limitations

Example 'Approaches'

Intuitive Judgement

Decisions based on experience and gut feeling

First-in, First-out (FIFO)

Projects handled in the order they arrive

Squeaky Wheel

Order based on urgency and most vocal stakeholders

Single-Criterion Ranking Order based on a single factor like cost or urgency



The Maturity Journey

How do we know what we need

Initial



- Process exists, but followed inconsistently
- Low stakeholder engagement
- Minimal data usage
- Limited, if any, documentation

Defined



- Utilizes an established and consistent process
- Regular stakeholder collaboration
- Improved data usage
- Improved documentation

Optimized



- People and process are tightly aligned to a tool and framework
- Deep stakeholder engagement
- Extensive data usage
- Robust documentation



Initial Maturity Prioritization

Evolve as you grow...

What to look for

- Basic process but inconsistent
- Minimal data used to inform decisions
- Limited stakeholder involvement
- Resource constraints
- Limited documentation

Example Approaches

Simple Scoring Model Scoring projects on simple predefined criteria.

MoSCoW Method

Categorize as Must have, Should have, Could have, Won't have

Eisenhower Matrix

Prioritizing based on urgency and importance

Getting things dialed in...

What to look for

- Established, consistent processes
- Structured and agreed upon frameworks
- Regular stakeholder collaboration
- Improved documentation and management of resources
- Increased data used for driving decisions

Example Approaches

Weighted Scoring Model Advanced scoring with weighted criteria

Weighted Shortest
Job First (WSJF)

Prioritizing based on cost of delay and job size

Balanced Scorecard

Evaluating projects from multiple perspectives

Optimize and accelerate results

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Traits of an Optimized Prioritization Process

Let's turn it up to 11!

- Advanced process that is clearly communicated across the organization
- Robust documentation and change management
- Omprehensive framework that aligns to organizational objectives
- O Deep stakeholder engagement and agreement
- Optimal resource management
- Proactive insights driven by extensive data utilization



Key Factors for Successful Prioritization

Taking it a step further

Process

- Standardization: Establish clear, consistent processes for prioritization.
- **Documentation**: Maintain thorough and up-to-date records of decisions, statuses, and criteria.

Culture

- Collaboration: Foster a collaborative environment with active stakeholder engagement.
- **Risk Tolerance**: Understand and align the organization's risk tolerance with prioritization decisions.

Continuous Improvement

- Feedback Loops: Implement regular review and feedback mechanisms.
- Data Utilization: Leverage data and analytics to refine prioritization frameworks.
- Adaptability: Be prepared to adjust frameworks as organizational needs and external conditions change.
