The codes and charges assigned in the hospital charge master serves as an internal support reference for billing and contracting with payers.

Ensure EvoEndo's product number and item list below is recorded in the chargemaster

Confirm assignment of items and codes to one or more revenue centers or departments including charges based on the facility standard practices

Assure all charges are updated and consistent based on current manufacturer and payer contracts

Assure the electronic medical record system includes all procedures and products, even those that may not be separately paid

Esophagoscopy

Endoscopy/Esophagoscopy guidelines describe esophagoscopy as examination from the cricopharyngeus muscle (upper esophageal sphincter) to and including the gastroesophageal junction. It may also include examination of the proximal region of the stomach via retroflexion when performed.

The distinction between the codes for rigid and flexible esophagoscopy is necessary because different devices, means of sedation, and/or anesthesia are used, and physician work (including risk) is different. Transoral rigid esophagoscopy is typically performed under general anesthesia; transoral flexible esophagoscopy is typically performed under moderate sedation; and transnasal flexible esophagoscopy is typically performed using topical anesthesia.¹

Esophagogastroduodenoscopy

Once an endoscope traverses the pyloric channel and enters the small intestine, the procedure is then described as esophagogastroduodenoscopy, or EGD. A complete esophagogastroduodenoscopy includes examination of the duodenum and/or jejunum.²
