

## **Five Things Patients and Physicians Should Question (2012)**<sup>12</sup>

- 1. Don't use cancer-directed therapy for solid tumor patients with the following characteristics: low performance status (3 or 4), no benefit from prior evidence-based interventions, and no strong evidence supporting the clinical value of further anti-cancer treatment.**

- 2. Don't perform PET, CT, and radionuclide bone scans, or newer imaging scans in the staging of early prostate cancer at low risk for metastasis.**

- 3. Don't perform PET, CT, and radionuclide bone scans in the staging of early breast cancer at low risk for metastasis.**

**6. Don't give patients starting on a chemotherapy regimen that has a low or moderate risk of causing nausea and vomiting antiemetic drugs intended for use with a regimen that has a high risk of causing nausea and vomiting.**

**7. Don't use combination cytotoxic chemotherapy (multiple drugs) instead of chemotherapy with one drug when treating an individual for metastatic breast cancer unless the patient needs a rapid response to relieve tumor-related symptoms.**

**8. Avoid using PET or PET-CT scanning as part of routine follow-up care to monitor for a cancer recurrence in asymptomatic patients who have finished initial treatment to eliminate the cancer unless there is high-level evidence that such imaging will change the outcome.**

- 10. The original Choosing Wisely Statement #10 recommended against using a targeted therapy intended for use against a specific genetic aberration unless a patient's tumor cells have a specific biomarker that predicts an effective response to the targeted therapy. While this statement continues to hold true, it is also currently being incorporated into a forthcoming ASCO Choosing Wisely 2021, which will update the currency and provide further context for this recommendation.**
