

# i-Ready Literacy Tasks Fact Sheet

Used as a complement to the *i-Ready Diagnostic* for Reading, *i-Ready Literacy Tasks* help provide a comprehensive snapshot of a student's overall reading performance. There are two task uses.



## i-Ready Literacy Benchmark Tasks

Benchmark Tasks use developmentally appropriate stimuli to determine whether a student is meeting foundational reading and fluency skills three times per year.

In addition to offering a benchmark assessment three times per year, the *i-Ready Literacy Benchmark Tasks* can be used in conjunction with the Diagnostic for universal literacy screening purposes. Using the two assessments together can identify students who may benefit from intervention for critical literacy skills. The tasks can also be used to screen for dyslexia risk factors addressed in state and district dyslexia risk factor screening requirements. Finally, when administered together, the tasks and Diagnostic provide teachers with perspective on students' reading proficiency and appropriate next steps to take for instruction.



## i-Ready Literacy Progress Monitoring Tasks

Progress Monitoring Tasks are commonly used to monitor the progress of students who are receiving reading intervention during the school year.

For students receiving targeted reading intervention, educators can use *i-Ready Literacy Progress Monitoring Tasks*. The tasks are available for Letter Sound Fluency, Phoneme Segmentation Fluency, Word Recognition Fluency, Pseudoword Decoding for Fluency, and Passage Reading Fluency. Progress monitoring reporting requirements differ by district and state, and the *i-Ready* tasks are designed to allow educators to fulfill a variety of needs.

The Benchmark and Progress Monitoring Tasks are modular and offer educators a choice in selecting tasks that best fit their literacy assessment needs. The tasks are administered by educators in a one-on-one, offline setting. Each task is educator scored and yields different performance-level results.

Tasks vary in the number of forms available, scoring, length, and recommended administration windows. The tables on the following pages summarize the key characteristics of each *i-Ready Literacy Task* type for benchmarking and progress monitoring purposes. Updates have been made to the i-Ready Literacy Tasks for the 2024–2025 school year.
