A. Spelling

Table with 6 columns for words (pool, good, football, wooden, cartoon) and rows for Student's Misspelling and Points. Total points for Activity A is 8.

B. Word Reading

Table with 7 columns for word categories (New Words, Multisyllabic Challenge Words, High-Frequency Words, Words with Prefixes and Suffixes) and rows for points. Total points for Activity B is 30.

The bird escaped and thanked the ant. And the ant said, "One good deed deserves another!"

D. Text Comprehension

1. **WHAT** happened when the ant leaned over to drink water from the brook?

When the ant leaned over, she lost her footing and fell in.

2. **HOW** did the bird help the ant?

The bird helped the ant by picking a leaf from the tree and tossing it into the water.

3. **HOW** did the ant help the bird?

The ant helped the bird by biting the hunter's foot, which made the hunter drop his net so the bird could escape.

4. **WHY** did the ant help the bird?

The ant helped the bird because Answers will vary: one good deed deserves another; the bird helped the ant.
