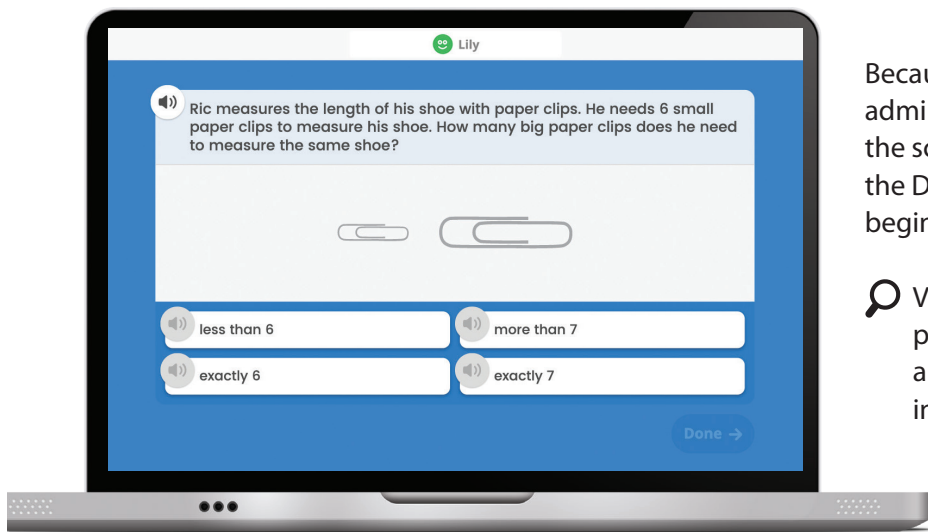
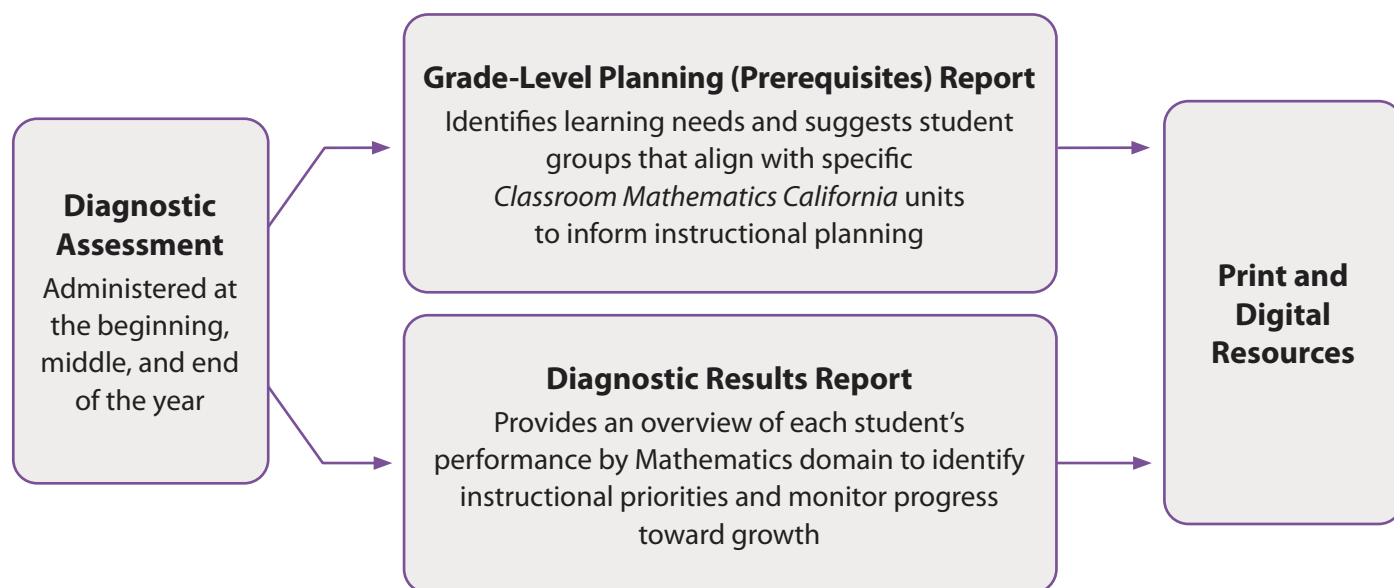


Data to Inform Your Instruction: *How the Diagnostic Assessment and Classroom Mathematics California Work Together*

The adaptive Diagnostic provides a global view of Grades K–12 skills, capturing a complete picture of student performance and growth, including insights into student learning to inform instructional decisions and, when needed, targeted remediation. The Diagnostic is typically administered at the beginning, middle, and end of the year in order to track student growth and changes in performance and needs after each 12- to 18-week instructional cycle.

Data and reports from the Diagnostic and *Classroom Mathematics California* resources drive teacher-led instruction and support student learning.



Because Diagnostic data is so valuable, and administering the Diagnostic happens early in the school year, it's important to learn about the Diagnostic and how to prepare for it at the beginning of the school year.
