Type Details	<i>Teacher: Read each type and details.</i> Students: Echo read each type and details.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• fable – animal characters behave like people; a lesson at the end teaches about human behavior• realistic fiction – made up, but believable, characters, setting, and events• mystery – main character may act as a detective; suspects are involved; clues are presented• historical fiction – takes place in the past and includes details from that time period
Examples	<i>Teacher: Read each example.</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The lesson from the fable “The Tortoise and the Hare” is that going slow and steady wins the race.• Realistic fiction might have a setting at a school and characters similar to people you know.• In the mystery, the detective solved the crime when she found fingerprints on a doorknob.• The historical fiction book is about the life of a boy during the American Revolution.
