Consider the suggestions below to engage students with *i-Ready* in your classroom.

Get Student Buy-In

Help students understand why their learning over the summer will help them in the coming school year and in their lives generally. Get them to reflect on their progress to date and on what they want to get out of the time and set goals for themselves.



Have Data Chats with Students

Schedule data chats with students about their learning. Having check-ins with students helps them reflect on their strengths and areas for improvement, create new goals, and set action plans. Use the:


