# Top-Performing Franklin Special School District Pursues Excellence 'for All'

Franklin Special School District (FSSD) in Tennessee's Williamson County is one of the state's top 10 districts for overall performance. This Grades pre-K-8 district's vision statement, "Excellence in Teaching and Learning for All," speaks to an overall commitment to continuous growth, community, and rigor.

In 2016, FSSD began looking for a new core math program that included robust professional development and instructional resources that were rigorous enough to prepare students for mastery of the Tennessee Academic Standards for Mathematics.

After a thorough evaluation, an adoption committee of administrators, teachers, and parents voted to implement Curriculum Associates' *Ready® Mathematics*—a rigorous, standards-aligned, and teacher-led math program—and Teacher Toolbox—a digital library of instructional resources—across its schools. "We are very intentional about having strategic and ongoing support for our teachers and administrators," said Mary Decker, Ed.D., associate director of schools for teaching and learning at FSSD.

Based on students' results and teachers' enthusiasm, the district rolled out the program to all students in Grades K–8 in January 2021.

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# What They Did

Indeed, the district had such a strong experience that FSSD decided to try Curriculum Associates' i-Ready Assessment, an award-winning assessment suite, in 2016. ### **Data Culture**

# What They Accomplished

Since FSSD implemented *Ready Mathematics, i-Ready,* and Teacher Toolbox, the district's students have continued to achieve impressive academic growth in both mathematics and ELA.

This success, which has led to numerous state recognitions, can be attributed to several factors, including the district's commitment to ongoing professional learning, the building of a strong and effective data culture, and the hard work of FSSD educators.

At the end of the 2020–2021 school year, educators' and students' accomplishments included:

- Outperforming the state proficiency rating (as measured by the TCAP) by double digits in math, ELA, social studies, and science
- An overall composite score of five, on a one to five scale, for student growth in both math and ELA based on state assessment data

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• Five FSSD schools earning "reward status" based on the schools' TCAP scores, student growth, English Learner progress, and chronically absent rates

Now, as FSSD educators look forward, they remain steadfast in their commitment to excellence. "Everyone from the top down is truly invested in the ongoing success of our students," said Carlton.

In 2022–2023, *i-Ready Assessment* and Personalized Instruction for Reading and Teacher Toolbox will have a reading/writing pilot at Freedom Intermediate, and Franklin Special will be sharing their success at the next *i-Ready* Tennessee Summit in September 2022.

"Even with great support and programs, such as what is provided by Curriculum Associates, you need district champions and a great team to make it all work," added Bracamontes. "And that's what we have here at FSSD."
