<b>Type Descriptions</b> Words or phrases that explain each type	<i>Teacher: Read each description.</i> <b>Students:</b> Repeat each description.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• corn – the seeds of the corn plant that can be eaten</li><li>• wheat – a grain that can be made into flour used in baked goods like bread and in other foods</li><li>• rice – small white or brown grains from a plant that are used for food</li></ul>
<b>Type Details</b>	<i>Teacher: Read each type and details.</i> <b>Students:</b> Echo read each type and details.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• corn – kernels grow on the spiked part of the plant called ears; popcorn, corn chips, corn flakes, corn bread</li><li>• wheat – grows as a grass; wheat flour, wheat bread, pasta, cereal, pancakes, pretzels</li><li>• rice – grows as a grass in wet fields; rice cakes, rice noodles, rice pudding, rice milk, fried rice, sushi</li></ul>
