New

No InVue products (keys, programming stations, or security devices)

Activate a **NEW** InVue key with a **NEW** programming station

Test the activated key on the newly installed InVue device. (This step transfers the site code to the device.)

✓ InVue Keys
✗ InVue Programming Station

Activate a **NEW** programming station with **EXISTING** keys

Test the activated key on an **EXISTING** InVue device

SUCCESSFUL:
Proceed with installation and use an activated key on every installed device to transfer the site code.

Activate **NEW** Keys on the **EXISTING** programming station
