





The Transition to Organic Partnership Program (TOPP)

connects producers interested in organic certification with experienced organic producer mentors, technical assistance resources, and organicfocused regional events. Mentors guide transitioning producers through the process of organic certification and share their expertise in organic farming. Intending to become certified organic?

- Get real-time advice and troubleshooting support from an experienced certified organic producer via site visits and regular communication.
- Receive a \$500 stipend for participating in the mentorship program.
- Connect to valuable, free technical assistance to help with paperwork and compliance.


