

Washing & Care Instructions:

- 1. FloorGuard textile mats require regular daily vacuuming. If using a power head, caution is advised. Use a vacuum power head with an adjustable height setting. The rotating brush should only lightly contact the surface of the mat without binding or pulling.**
- 2. Heavy lint from vacuuming is normal for the first few weeks. Shedding lint is a common characteristic of cotton. This will gradually subside.**
- 3. On very wet or snowy days, use a regular wet vacuum to pick up and remove excess moisture.**
- 4. When the textile mats become soiled or encrusted with salt residue, they can be cleaned using the following recommended methods;**
 - A. Use clean warm water and a carpet extractor.**
 - B. Rinse mats with a garden hose to remove loose dirt and salt residue.**
 - C. Pour clean water on effected area and remove dirty water with a wet/dry vacuum**
 - D. The use of salt neutralizer is also recommended to reduce the damaging effects of unwanted salt stains. Follow manufacturer's directions for dilution ratios and proper use.**
- 5. Squeeze excess water out of mat with a squeegee and air dry.**

Precautions:

- Do not put Commercial FloorGuard textile mats in a domestic washing machine. Commercial grade mats are too large and bulky to put into a residential machine which could result in damage to the washing machine.**
- Do not put Commercial FloorGuard textile mats in a domestic dryer. Commercial grade mats are too large and bulky to put into a residential machine which could result in damage to the dryer. Excessive heat could also damage the backing material of the mat and cause unwanted marking on the inside of the dryer.**
- Do not use a pressure washer to clean FloorGuard textile mats. The high pressure will damage the fabric.**
