01 GETTING STARTED

- 1. Plug the barrel connector on the power adapter cord into the power input port on the control unit.
- 2. Plug the air hose extension into the control unit.
- 3. Plug the power cord to a wall outlet.

Note: Do not use the power adapter to charge or power other devices.



- 4. Unzip the boot or boots you want to use for your massage.
- 5. The boots are labeled L (left leg) and R (right leg).
- 6. Find a comfortable place to sit or recline with your legs extended for the duration of your massage and remove any footwear.
 - Wearing trousers and socks are recommended
- 7. Pull each boot over left & right legs and zip the boot up all the way to the top of the zipper track.

- When using only 3 or 4 zones manually, do not roll over the boot or zip it mid-way to prevent damage
- Never unzip the boots when they are inflated, as this will damage them.
- Attempting to operate the zipper when not deflated can cause damage. Lock the zippers in place by flipping the zipper tabs down fully flat against the zipper track. The tabs should point towards the toes of the boots. Failure to properly lock the zippers may cause the boot to open during inflation, reducing compression

02 CONNECTING THE AIR HOSES




Single-Boot Usage

04 OPERATING THE MASSAGER:

1. Power On/Off:

To turn on: Press and hold the power button.
