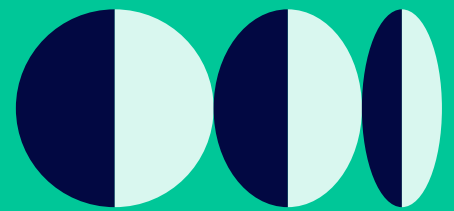

Course content and strategies:

General French

The key concept is communication. We use task-based and cooperative approaches to create a positive learning environment where the emphasis is on practical classroom activities. All aspects of the French language are covered - speaking, listening, reading, writing and mediating, as well as pronunciation, vocabulary and grammar activities through a variety of media.

Methodology - Module

A blend of theory and practice. Participants will engage in practical activities based on task-based learning and communicative language teaching. We aim to equip participants with ideas and materials that can be used with their own students. Throughout the training, participants are given the opportunity to consider alternative practices, reflect on and share their own practices, and try out a variety of classroom activities.
