# PEDIATRIC REHABILITATION



McLaren Northern Michigan's Pediatric Rehabilitation program delivers comprehensive, multidisciplinary outpatient therapy services for infants, children, and adolescents with developmental, physical, cognitive, behavioral, and communication needs. Care is provided by pediatric-specialized occupational therapists, physical therapists, and speech-language pathologists who collaborate closely with referring providers and families to develop individualized, evidence-based plans of care.

Using a coordinated, team-based approach, our clinicians evaluate functional limitations, establish measurable goals, and implement therapeutic interventions that support progress across home, school, and community settings. Our program is designed to complement medical management, with a strong emphasis on timely communication, continuity throughout treatment, and outcome reporting to referring providers.

## OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

### Services include:

- Activities of daily living (ADLs)
- Sensory processing and integration
- Fine motor and visual-motor development
- Play-based functional skill development
- Behavioral regulation strategies
- Functional cognition for school and home participation

## PHYSICAL THERAPY

### Services include:

- Developmental milestone achievement
- Balance, coordination, and postural control
- Strength and endurance training
- Gait and movement analysis
- Adaptive equipment evaluation and caregiver education

## SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGY

### Services include:

- Expressive and receptive language development
- Speech sound production and articulation
- Social communication and pragmatic language
- Cognitive-communication intervention
- Feeding and swallowing therapy
- Augmentative and alternative communication (AAC)
- Fluency and stuttering therapy

## CONDITIONS COMMONLY REFERRED

- Developmental delays (motor, speech, sensory, or behavioral)
- Neurological or genetic conditions impacting function
- Feeding and swallowing disorders
- Orthopedic or musculoskeletal impairments
- School readiness and participation challenges
- Sensory processing and behavioral regulation concerns
- Communication and social-pragmatic disorders
